The Rhone Rangers started from a small gathering of American vintners dedicated to the production of wines from the grapes native to France's Rhone Valley who began meeting informally in the 1980s. As their numbers expanded, they organized themselves under the name "Rhone Rangers." These grapes include the 22 traditional varieties approved by the French government grown in the Cotes du Rhone, as well as Durif (Petite Sirah).
